# Equator, Tropics, Hemispheres and Poles Northern Hemisphere Southern Hemisphere

Different instruments can be used measure and record the weather.



Countries around the world have different climates. Countries near the equator have hotter climates and the Arctic and Antarctic have much colder climates. Climates can affect many things, such as which plants can grow. Many animals are specially adapted to the climate they live in.

Countries around the world have different climates. Climates can be sorted into the following zones: warm, cold (or polar), tropical and temperate. Countries near the equator tend to have a hotter climate. Different animals are better suited to living in countries with a particular climate.

### Our Weather

The weather in the United Kingdom can change from day to day. The four seasons have particular weather patterns. You could keep a weather diaru by measuring the temperature (using a thermometer) and recording your observations.



## Weather

Weather is the day to day changes that we see happen. So, it can be sunny one day and rainy the next.

## Climate

Climate is the average weather usually taken over 30 years for a particular place.
