In Art, we will be learning about famous portrait artists and completing works in their style. This week, we will experiment with different materials to create our self-portraits.




Week 6

Express! Messy Maps!

This week, we will use all of our learning to create a 'messy map' of our school and local area. We will need to think about the materials we will use to represent the different features and create a key so that our map is accessible and understood.

In Art, we will be creating our final self portraits in the style of Picasso.



Week 3 Compass points

This week, we will recap our learning on the compass points: North, East, South and West before using them to navigate around a map, in the search of hidden letters.

In Art, we will be learning about how we can use different types of line to create the different features on a portrait.

Week 5 Making Maps

Now, we will use the data and information we found from our fieldwork to create maps of our school and the surrounding local area. We will learn about effective and appropriate symbols, colour codes and the importance of using a key when creating a map.

In Art, we will learn about position in portraits and how we can draw lines to make sure we structure our drawings accurately.

Week 4 Fieldwork

As geographers this week, we will be collecting data about our local area. This could be the types of houses, buildings and how land is used. We will use tally charts to collect our data ready to present next week.
