
Dear Families,

We hope you had a great summer holiday and are looking forward to the Autumn term. We have a busy half term ahead, which is packed with lots of learning.

Our first learning theme is 'All About Me'. We will enjoy getting to know each other better and building knowledge of our bodies, families, local community and academy.

Our work in maths this half term will give us a foundation of knowledge to be built upon throughout the academic year. Our key mathematical themes will be counting, comparison and pattern. We will begin learning Phase 2 phonics this half term using the Little Wandle phonics scheme. Keep checking

Tapestry to see how you can support your child with the graphemes we are learning in class. This half term in literacy, our focus is on labelling and writing our names. Children will use their increased phonics knowledge to support and build confidence in their writing. Our key Talk4Writing text will be 'Owl Babies' by Martin Waddell.



We will begin EYFS Baseline Assessments this half term.
