Dear Families.

Welcome to Reception! We hope you had a great Summer holiday and are looking forward to the first Autumn term. We have a busy term ahead, packed with lots of fun learning!

Our learning theme for this half term is 'All about me'. We will enjoy getting to know ourselves and each other better and building our knowledge of our bodies, families, local community and school.

Our work in Maths this half-term will give us a foundation of knowledge to be built upon throughout the academic year. We will explore a range of number -based mathematical concepts, including subitising, counting, cardinality, composition and comparison, alongside wider mathematical concepts such as matching and sorting, patterns and time.

We will begin learning Phase 2 Phonics this half term using the Little Wandle Phonics scheme. Keep checking Tapestry to see how you can support your child with the graphemes we will learn in class.

• OWL BABIES

This half-term, our Literacy learning focus is name writing and labelling. Children will use their increasing Phonics knowledge to support and build confidence in their writing. Our key text will be 'Owl Babies' by Martin Waddell.
