Dear Families,

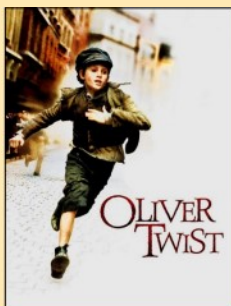
Welcome back to the start of the Summer Term. We hope you had an enjoyable Easter half-term. We look forward to showing off our knowledge in the upcoming **SATs week**.

**The assessment week is 13-16th May. Please ensure your child has had a 'hearty' breakfast each morning.**



In **Mathematics**, we are revising arithmetic questions, including the four operations: addition, multiplication, subtraction and division. Also, we are deepening our reasoning skills to secure our knowledge further on ratio, scaling and proportional reasoning.

In **Reading**, the children will read the book 'Oliver Twist' by *Charles Dickens* in English to understand how language can change over the years.



In **Writing**, the children will write an adventure story using the literary device of suspense. We will continue to develop our spelling, grammar and punctuation skills. This will focus on relative clauses, past progressive tense, punctuation and figurative language.



Within the wider curriculum, the children will learn about Africa in Geography, Reproduction in Science and The Cold War in History.
