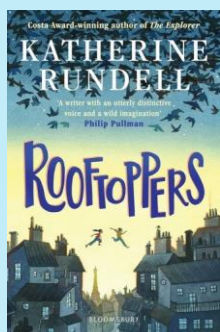

English

Writing:

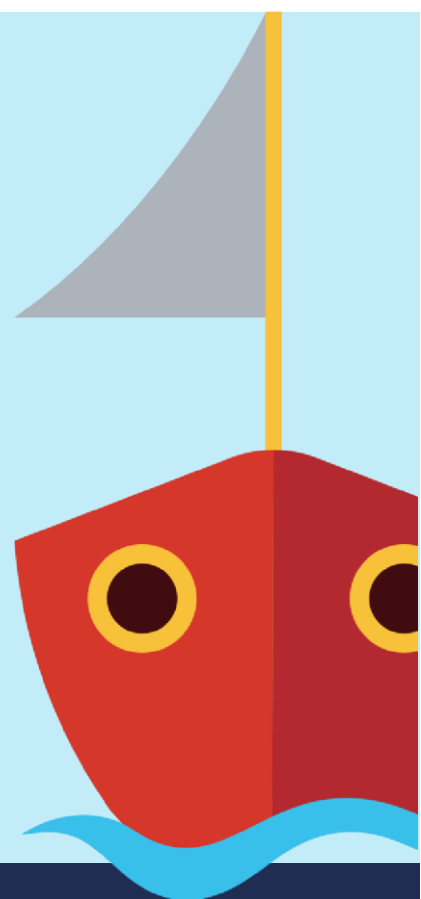
In our writing lessons, Year 6 children will be focusing on practising and revising key spelling and grammar they are expected to understand and use in year 6.

For example, children will be writing autobiographies where they will practise identifying and using different word classes and clauses in their sentences.



Reading:

In our reading lessons, Year 6 children will be reading a book called '*Rooftoppers*', by Katherine Rundell. This follows the story of Sophie and Charles who visit Paris on a hunt for answers. Whilst there, Sophie discovers the Rooftoppers community. We will be developing our skills of inference and retrieval through reading this and supporting texts.

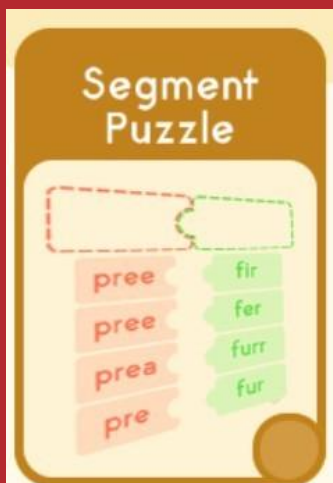
Mathematics

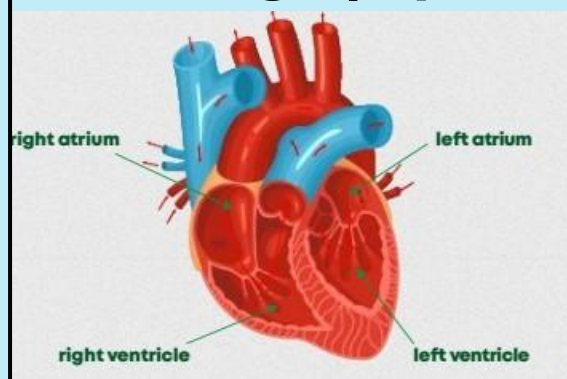
Homework:

Geography
